CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

2005-2006

SEASON

1. SCORING

- a) All Club Championship races will be scored with the Modified Cox-Sprague system in Appendix E1.
- b) For long distance races, all races will be scored equally irrespective of distance.

2. CHAMPIONSHIPS TO COMPETE FOR

- a) P.Y.S. Inshore Championship
- b) I.R.C. Inshore Championship
- c) P.Y.S. OffShore Championship
- d) I.R.C. Off-Shore Championship
- e) P.Y.S. Overall Championship
- f) I.R.C. Overall Championship
- g) P.Y.S. Total Aggregate Points Championship
- h) I.R.C. Total Aggregate Points Championship
- i) Most Improved Helm of the Year
- j) Crew of the Year
- k) Yachtsman of the Year
- l) Rookie of the Year

3. INSHORE CHAMPIONSHIP

Races to count will be 50% of Harbor and Geometric races sailed by the Class (including the Picornell Series), rounded up to the next highest full number, plus 1. As an example: if 15 Harbor and Geometric Races were completed by the Class. A yacht's points earned will be calculated as the highest points scored in 9 races by that yacht.

4. OFFSHORE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Four races of seven races to count towards Club Off-shore Championship.

5. TOTAL AGGREGATE POINTS CHAMPIONSHIP

The Aggregate Points championship go to boats that did not place first, second or third in the overall championship but which have sailed more than 50% of inshore and offshore races. Total points are calculated by combining a boat's finishes in all Harbour and Offshore races.

6. PYS AND IRC OVERALL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Highest score from 12 Harbor Races and 3 Offshore races to be totalled together.

Annual Special Awards

MOST IMPROVED HELM OF THE YEAR. Given to the Club sailor whose helming ability and race results, in the opinion of the Sailing Committee, has improved the most during the racing season.

CREW OF THE YEAR. Given to the Club sailor, who in the opinion of the yacht owners, has contributed most to club activities - racing, training, and committee work.

YACHTSMAN OF THE YEAR. Given to the Club member who, in the opinion of the Sailing Committee, has made the largest contribution to sailing, taking into consideration sailing skills and race participation, involvement with the Club's Training Program, involvement in international sailing activities, bringing credit to the Club and contribution to the Administration of the Sailing activity within the Club.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR. Given to a skipper with less than two years of helming experience who, in the opinion of the Sailing Committee, has contributed most to Club activities – racing, training, and committee work.
